

## Make the Pieced Units


• Join the long edges of two F HSTs to opposite sides of a G square. Press the seam allowances away from the square. Repeat to join two F HSTs to the remaining two edges of the square. Press the seam allowances away from the square. Trim to 5" x 5". Make 12 G/F units.



Join the long edge of one F HST to each short edge of the H triangle.
Press the seams away from the H triangle. Trim to 2<sup>3</sup>/4" x 5". Make 4 H and 4 H-reversed units.







**H unit** Make 4. H-reversed unit Make 4.


Oraw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each A square.

Place a marked A square on each corner of an I rectangle, right sides

together. Sew on the diagonal line. Trim the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press the seam allowances away from the rectangle. Make 16 I units.





**l unit** Make 16.

## Assemble the Vertical Rows

• Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for fabric placement, arrange four I units in one vertical row, aligning the short ends. Join the units together along adjacent short ends to create a single row. Join a 2<sup>3</sup>/4" x 60<sup>1</sup>/2" white strip to each long edge of the row. Press the seams toward the strips. Make four I rows.

Arrange four G/F units, three B and two D rectangles as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Join the units and rectangles along adjacent edges to make a G/F row. Press the seams open. Make 3 G/F rows.

 Arrange four H units, three C and two E rectangles as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Join the units and rectangles along adjacent short edges. Press the seams open to complete the right side row. Repeat with the H-reversed units to make the left side row.


## Assembly

• Arrange the I, G/F, right and left side rows as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Join the rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seams in one direction.

## Finishing

• Remove the selvages, then cut the backing fabric into two equal lengths. Sew the two pieces together along one long edge, using a 1/2" seam allowance. Press the seam open.

Layer the quilt back, batting and quilt top. Quilt as desired. Stitch around the perimeter of the quilt, a scant 1/4" from the edge. Trim the excess fabric and batting. Use your favorite method to bind the quilt.
