


Fabric strips are arranged to create a landscape that mirrors itself midway through the quilt setting. The body of the quilt is constructed by alternating strip-pieced columns with sashings; then surrounded by two borders. The optional folded Accent Border adds dimensional appeal.



For this strikingly simple quilt with modern flair,
paint your favorite landscape with Anthology Story Strips!
1 set of Story Strips (20 strips) makes the becoming Bed Scarf.
2 sets of the same Story Strips (2 of 20 strips) will make this healthy-sized throw
that is perfect for any room in your home.

Here's what you need:

- 1/8 yard of 20 fabrics, OR 1 or 2 Sets of the same Anthology Story Strips of your choice (depending upon size), Story Strip BA-212-106 shown here.
- 1/8 Yard of Fabric 6 (BA-9118), if using Story Strips. (Used twice in strip set).
 BA-9112 from strip set is used as Sashing/Outer Border (S).
- 2 3/4 Yards of BA-9112 if using Story Strips BA-212-106, or 3 Yards of a complimentary batik for Background, Sashing and Border (S)
- 1/4 yard for Inner Accent Border (BA-9109)
- 3/4 Yard for Binding (BA-9113)
- Painter's Tape for labeling fabrics
- Extra-fine Sharpie Pen (Black) for writing on Painter's Tape
- Rotary Cutter, Cutting Mat & 6 in. x 24 in. Ruler
- 4 1/2 Yards (Throw), 2 Yards (Bed Scarf) for Backing. Batting to match backing size.



Please read all instructions carefully before you begin

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

S - Background/Sashing/Border

Horizontal Background Strips

- Bed Scarf: Cut (2); Throw: Cut (3) 2.5 in. strips
- Bed Scarf: Cut (2); Throw: Cut (4) 1.5 in strips

For Bed Scarf, cut strips in half so that you have (4) 2.5 in. strips and (4) 1.5 in. strips. Place a piece of painter's tape on the selvage end of each strip, and mark with an (*S*). Set aside.

Borders & Background Sashings

From Length of Fabric (LOF)

- Bed Scarf: Cut (4); Throw: Cut (4) 3.5 in. strips for the Outer Borders
- Bed Scarf: Cut (4); Throw: Cut (9) 2.5 in. strips for Background Sashing.

For Bed Scarf: from (2) 3.5 in strips, sub-cut (1) 24.5 in. and (1) 31 in. strips from each for top & bottom borders. Label & set aside.

AB - Folded Accent Border & Binding From WOF

- Bed Scarf: Cut (4); Throw: Cut (6) 1 in. strips for the Folded Accent Border; label & set aside.
- Set the remaining fabric aside for the Binding.

SET THE SCENE with Story Strips

BED SCARF NOTE: Before you continue, cut each Story Strip in half for 2 sets of 2.5 in strips.

- 1. Fold 1 set of 2 1/2" strips in half & arrange your "landscape".
- 2. Set a 2 1/2" Background Strip (S) in place as shown on page one.
- 3. When satisfied with your scene, place a piece of painter's tape on the selvage end of each strip. Starting with "5" at the top, label all fabrics with a Sharpie marker as shown page one.

WITH THE SECOND SET OF STORY STRIPS . . .

- Separate the strips and fold them in half (4 layers); align raw edges well.
- 2. Cut each strip 1 1/2 in. x WOF.
- Set the 1 in. strips aside for an a future project, or sew them together to make a pieced casing for a pillow case to go with your Bed Scarf or Throw.
- 4. Arrange the 1 1/2 in. strips in the exact order as the first set of 2 1/2 in. strips.
- 5. Put 1 1/2 in. Background strips (S) in place as above.
- 6. Place a piece of painter's tape on the selvage end of each strip.
- Using the Sharpie marker, number the fabrics exactly as you did above.

MAKE STRIP SET UNITS 1 & 2

1. Sew strips together in pairs.

- $2. \quad \hbox{ Join pairs together to complete each set.} \\$
- 3. To minimize bulk, press seams open with minimal pressure.

Strip Set 1A



Start Here with S + #1

Note that strips sets 1 & 2 are arranged exactly alike. Alternating strip widths creates a ripple effect.

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Strip Set 1B Strip Set 2B s Start Here 8 with 9 S + #810 NOTE: 11 2B strip 12 set will be 13 shorter than B1. Strip Set 20 Strip Set 10 S Start Here 14 15 with S + #1416 NOTE: 17 C2 Strip 18 ends with 19 1 1/2 in. of 20 #20 S End with #20, not (S)

MAKE BLOCKS - From width of strip set, cut (4) or (8) 5 1/4" blocks.

To minimize distortion, the strip sets are cut into Blocks, then sewn together to form columns. Cross-cut (4) or (8) blocks from each strip set depending upon the size of your project. Label each as below.













COMPLETE COLUMNS & ASSEMBLE to FINISH

Join blocks to make (4) or (8) sets of units 1 (A,B,C) & 2 (A,B,C).

- 1. Rotate **unit 2** 180° so that the 1.5 in. strip of #20 is at the top and the 1.5 in. strip of (S) is at the bottom.
- 2. Sew **unit 2** to the **bottom** of unit 1 to complete the column. You will have (4) or (8) complete colorful columns.

Add Sashing to Columns

- 1. Arrange columns according to the diagram images on the front.
- 2. Cut (4) or (9) Sashing Strips to the average column length. Set (2) Sashing strips aside for Outer Sashings.
- 3. Join columns & sashings together to complete the quilt body.
- 4. Press all seams open to minimize bulk.

Add Folded Accent Border

- 1. Sew the Accent Border Strips to make 1 continuous strip.
- 2. Press the Accent Border in half lengthwise.
- 3. Align and pin the raw edge of the Accent Border along the right side of the remaining (2) Sashing strips.
- 4. Baste stitch 1/8 in. from the edge to secure.
- Align, pin, and sew an Outer Sashing/Accent Border to the left and right side to complete the quilt body. Press seam outward.
- Align and pin the raw edge of the Accent Border along the top and bottom of the quilt body.
- 7. Baste stitch 1/8 in. from the edge to secure.

Add Outer Border

For Bed Scarf: Split the 4th column for (2) pieces measuring 24.5 in. x 5 1/4 in. Match raw edges along the bottom of each piece with a 3.5 in. x 24 in. Outer Border Strip. Sew together with a 1/4 in. seam. Press seam outward.

- 1. Cut (2) of the 3 1/2 in. Border strips to measure the length of the quilt body.
- 2. Align, pin, and sew the Outer Border to the left and right.
- 3. Press seams to the outside edge.
- 4. Repeat steps 1-4 to add the final top & bottom Outer Borders.

Finishing

Prepare backing and batting and cut 8" larger than the top. Quilt as you like, trim, and bind to finish! **Enjoy!**
