

Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

From Fabric A:

- 1. Cut two 4" strips. Reserve for strip piecing. (Horizontal Sashing Blocks)
- 2. Cut two 7 1/2" strips. Reserve for strip piecing. (Vertical Sashing Blocks)
- Cut one 1 1/2" strip. Reserve for strip piecing. (Cornerstones)
- Cut seven 2" strips. Piece strips and subcut two
 x 58" and two 2" x 63 1/2" strips. (Inner Border #1)
- 5. Cut seven 2" strips. Piece strips and subcut two 2" x 63" and two 2" x 68 1/2" strips. (Inner Border #2)

From Fabric B:

Pieced blocks

- 1. Cut seven 1 1/2" strips. Subcut one hundred fifty-six 1 1/2" squares and twelve 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles.
- 2. Cut two 2" strips. Subcut thirty-six 2" squares.
- 3. Cut one 3" strip. Subcut twenty-four 1 1/2" x 3" rectangles.
- 4. Cut three 3 1/2" strips. Subcut thirty-six 2" x 3 1/2" and twelve 1" x 3 1/2" rectangles.

Horizontal and Vertical sashing blocks

- 5. Cut two 1 1/2" strips. Reserve for strip piecing.
- 6. Cut two 8 1/2" strips. Subcut thirty-two 2 1/4" x 8 1/2" rectangles.

- 7. Cut two 15 1/2" strips. Subcut thirty 2 1/4" x 15 1/2" rectangles.
- 8. Cut six 2 1/4" strips. Reserve for strip piecing. (Cornerstones)

From Fabric C:

- Cut three 1 1/2" strips. Reserve for strip piecing. (Cornerstones)
- 2. Cut two 2 1/4" strips. Reserve for strip piecing. (Cornerstones)
- 3. Cut seven 1" strips. Piece strips and subcut two 1" x 64" and two 1" x 71 1/2" strips. (Inner Border #4)
- 4. Cut eight 2 1/4" strips. Piece strips to make one continuous binding strip. (Binding)

From Fabric D:

- 1. Cut one 1 1/2" strip. Subcut twelve 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)
- Cut one 2" strip. Subcut twelve 2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)
- Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut twenty-four 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric E:

 Cut two 1 1/2" strips. Subcut forty-eight 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric F:

1. Cut one 1 1/2" strip. Subcut twenty-four 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric G:

1. Cut two 1 1/2" strips. Subcut forty-eight 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric H:

1. Cut one 7 1/2" strip. Subcut two 7 1/2" x 8 1/2", two 1" x 8 1/2", two 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles; and four 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric I:

1. Cut seven 1 1/2" strips. Piece strips and subcut two 1 1/2" x 60" and two 1 1/2" x 66 1/2" strips. (Inner Border #2)

From Fabric J:

 Cut one 7 1/2" strip. Subcut two 7 1/2" x 8 1/2", two 1" x 8 1/2", two 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles; and four 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric K:

 Cut one 7 1/2" strip. Subcut two 7 1/2" x 8 1/2", two 1" x 8 1/2", two 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles; and four 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric L:

 Cut one 7 1/2" strip. Subcut two 7 1/2" x 8 1/2", two 1" x 8 1/2", two 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles; and four 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)

From Fabric M:

1. Cut one 7 1/2" strip. Subcut two 7 1/2" x 8 1/2", two 1" x 8 1/2", two 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles; and four 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)


From Fabric N:

- 1. Cut one 7 1/2" strip. Subcut two 7 1/2" x 8 1/2", two 1" x 8 1/2", two 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles; and four 1 1/2" squares. (Pieced Blocks)
- 2. Cut eight 3 1/2" strips. Piece strips and subcut two 3 1/2" x 70" and two 3 1/2" x 72 1/2" strips. (Outer Border)

Piecing Instructions:

Pieced Blocks

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 1 1/2" B square. Place marked square, right sides together, on one corner of one 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" D rectangle as shown. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal B corner triangle. Repeat with another 1 1/2" B square on the opposite diagonal corner of the same D rectangle to make a parallelogram unit (Figure 1).
- 2. Add one 1 1/2" x 3" B rectangle to the top of previously sewn unit Z(Figure 2).
- 3. Repeat to make a mirror-imaged unit (Figure 3).



- 4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 2" B square. Place square, right sides together, on one 2" D square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of drawn line. Cut along drawn line to yield two half-square-triangle (HST) units. Open and press. Align diagonal seam of HST units against 45 degree line on quilting ruler and trim units to measure 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" raw edge to raw edge (Figure 4).
- 5. Sew together following fabric pieces to make row units. Row unit 1: two 1 1/2" B and one 1 1/2" E squares. Row unit 2: two 1 1/2" E and one 1 1/2" F squares. Row unit 3: one HST unit made in step 2, one 1 1/2" B and one 1 1/2" E squares.
- 6. Sew together row units to make a pink flower unit. Unit measures 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" unfinished (Figure 5).
- 7. Add to the top of flower unit one 2" x 3 1/2" B rectangle (Figure 6).

- 8. Sew together following fabric pieces to make row units. Row unit 1: two 1 1/2" B and one 1 1/2" G squares. Row unit 2: two 1 1/2" G and one 1 1/2" F squares. Row unit 3: two 1 1/2" B and one 1 1/2" G squares.




Figure 7 Make 12

- 9. Sew together row units to make a red flower unit. Unit measures 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" unfinished (Figure 7).
- 10. Sew one 1" x 3 1/2" B rectangle to the top of flower unit (Figure 8).

- 11. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 1 1/2" D square. Place square, right sides together at the bottom right corner of one 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" B rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal D corner triangle (Figure 9).
- 12. Sew together unit and remaining HST unit made in step 4. and add to the bottom of red flower unit (Figure 10).
- 13. Sew units together as shown to complete Section 1. Section measures 5" x 8 1/2" unfinished (Figure 11).



Section 2

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 1 1/2" Print square. Place square, right sides together, at the top right corner of one 2" x 3 1/2" B rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal Print corner triangle (Figure 12).
- 2. Repeat to make a mirror-imaged unit (Figure 12).
- 3. Sew both units to the opposite short sides of one 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" Print rectangle (Figure 13).




Figure 14 Make 2 of each print fabric.

- 4. Add one 1" x 8 1/2" Print rectangle to the top of sewn unit to complete Section 2. Section measures 4" x 8 1/2" unfinished (Figure 14).

Section 3

- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 2" B square. Place square, right sides together, at the top left corner of one 7 1/2" x 8 1/2" Print rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal B corner triangle (Figure 15).
- Repeat with another 2" B square at the top right corner, and two 1 1/2" B squares at the bottom left and bottom right corners of the same Print rectangle to complete section (Figure 15).



Assembling Sections

1. Sew together all sections to complete one pieced block (Figure 16). Block measures 8 1/2" x 15 1/2" unfinished.



2. Make a total of two blocks for the following Prints (Figure 17)



Constructing Horizontal Sashing Blocks






Figure 18 Make 16. Sew two 2 1/4" x 8 1/2" B rectangles to the opposite long sides of one unit made in step 1 to complete one horizontal sashing block. Block measures 5" x 8 1/2" unfinished. Make a total of sixteen horizontal sashing blocks (Figure 19).

1. Sew two 4" A strips to the opposite long sides of one 1 1/2" B strip. Subcut at 1 1/2" intervals for a total of sixteen units (Figure 18).




Constructing Vertical Sashing Blocks

1. Sew two 7 1/2" A strips to the opposite long sides of one 1 1/2" B strips. Subcut at 1 1/2" x intervals for a total of fifteen units (Figure 20).




2. Sew two 2 1/4" x 15 1/2" B rectangles to the opposite long sides of one unit made in step 1 to complete one vertical sashing block. Block measures 5" x 15 1/2" unfinished. Make a total of fifteen vertical sashing blocks (Figure 21).



Constructing Cornerstones

- Sew two 2 1/4" B strips to the opposite long sides of one 1 1/2" C strip. Cut pieced strip sets at 2 1/4" intervals. Make a total of three pieced strip sets to cut a total of forty Unit A (Figure 22).
- Sew two 2 1/4" C strips to the opposite long sides of one 1 1/2" A strip. Cut pieced strip sets at 1 1/2" intervals for a total of twenty Unit B (Figure 23).
- 3. Sew together two Unit A and one unit B to make one cornerstone. Cornerstone measures 5" x 5" unfinished. Make a total of (20) cornerstones (Figure 24).




Quilt Assembly:

- 1. Pieced rows: Refer to quilt ptoto and diagram for block placement guide, arrange and sew together four pieced blocks and five vertical sashing blocks to make a pieced row. Make a total of three pieced rows.
- Pieced sashing rows: Sew together five cornerstones and four horizontal sashing blocks to make a pieced sashing row. Make a total of four pieced sashing rows.
- 3. Sew together pieced rows and pieced sashing rows to complete quilt center.
- 4. Inner border #1: Sew two 2" x 63 1/2" A strips to the opposite sides of quilt center, followed by two 2" x 58" A strips to the top and bottom of quilt center.
- 5. Inner border #2: Sew two 1 1/2" x 66 1/2" I strips to the opposite sides of quilt center, followed by two 1 1/2" x 60" I strips to the top and bottom of quilt center.
- 6. **Inner border #3:** Sew two 2" x 68 1/2" A strips to the opposite Isides of quilt center, followed by two 2" x 63" A strips to the top and bottom of quilt center.


- 7. Inner border #4: Sew two 1" x 71 1/2" C strips to the opposite sides of quilt center, followed by two 1" x 64" C strips to the top and bottom of quilt center.
- Outer border: Sew two 3 1/2" x 72 1/2" N strips to the opposite sides of quilt center, followed by two 3 1/2" x 70" N strips to the top and bottom of quilt center to complete quilt top.

Finishing:

- 1. Prepare backing with one seam to measure 78" x 88". Press seam open.
- 2. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim layers even with quilt top squaring corners.
- 5. Join 2 1/4" C binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together to make double-fold binding. Attach binding to quilt using your favorite method.
- 6. Make a label and sew to the back of the quilt.
