Finished quilt size: $81\frac{1}{2}$ " x $81\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric Requirements

15/8 yards Kim-C6100 Peony
1 yard Soho-White
12/3 yards Dot-C1820 Black
(includes 2/3 yard for binding)
11/4 yards Kim-C6100 Rose
21/2 yards Fleur-C8067 Black
7/8 yard Stripe-C8109 Black
71/2 yards fabric of your choice of backing
90" × 90" batting

Cutting

From Kim-C6100 Peony:

• Cut six $9^{1/2}$ " × width-of-fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut sixty-four $3^{1/2}$ " × $9^{1/2}$ " strips.

From Soho-White:

- Cut two $6^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty-four $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " rectangles.
- Cut six $3^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips. Sub-cut sixty-four $3^{1/2}$ " squares.

From Dot-C1820 Black:

- Cut six $3^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips. Sub-cut sixty-four $3^{1/2}$ " squares.
- Cut eight 2" × WOF strips for inner border.
- Cut nine $2^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips for binding.

From Kim-C6100 Rose:

• Cut six $6^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips. Sub-cut sixty-four $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " rectangles.

From Fleur-C8067 Black:

- Cut six $9^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips. Sub-cut sixty-four $3^{1/2}$ " × $9^{1/2}$ " strips.
- Cut eight $3^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips for the outer border.

From Stripe-C8109 Black:

• Cut four $6^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips. Sub-cut forty $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " rectangles.

Block Construction

All seam allowances are 1/4" and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press seams in the direction shown.

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the 3¹/₂" Soho-White squares. Noting

the orientation, place one marked square right sides together on the right end of one $3^1/2^{11} \times 9^1/2^{11}$ C8067 Black strip. Sew along the marked line and trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1/4^{11}$ seam allowance (*figure 1*). Press the seam allowances open. Make thirty-two of Unit One.

2. Noting the orientation of the marked line, place a marked 3¹/₂" Soho-White square right sides together on the left end of a 3¹/₂" × 9¹/₂" C8067 Black rectangle. Sew along the marked line and trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance (*figure 2*). Press the seam allowances open. Make thirty-two of Unit Two.






Unit Two Make 32.

3. Place one 31/2" × 61/2" Soho-White rectangle right sides together on the left corner of one 31/2" × 61/2" C6100 Rose rectangle as shown. Mark a diagonal line from the upper right corner to the midpoint of the left edge of the Soho-White rectangle. The corner of the Rose rectangle aligns with the midpoint of the Soho-White rectangle. Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (*figure 3*). Press the seam allowances open. Make twelve of Unit Three.



4. Place one $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " Soho-White rectangle right sides together on the right corner of one $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " C6100 Rose rectangle as shown. Mark a diagonal line from the upper left corner to the midpoint of the right edge of the Soho-White rectangle. The corner of the Rose rectangle aligns with the midpoint of the Soho-White rectangle. Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (figure 4). Press the seam allowances open. Make twelve of Unit Four.

5. Repeat steps 1 and 2, using 3¹/₂" C1820 Black squares and $3^{1/2}$ " \times $9^{1/2}$ " 6100 Peony strips (*figure 5*). Make thirty-two each of Units Five and Six. Fig. 5

6. Repeat steps 3 and 4, using $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " C6100 Rose rectangles and $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " C8109 Black rectangles (figure 6). Make twenty each of Units Seven and Eight.







7. Referring to the block diagrams below, arrange the units needed to make each block (*figure 7*). Matching adjacent seams, sew the quadrants together in each row. Press. Matching adjacent seams, sew the rows together. Press. Make two of each block, each measuring 181/2" square.





Block Diagrams Make 2 of each block.









Block Eight

Quilt Top Assembly

- 8. Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for placement, arrange the blocks in four rows of four blocks each. *Note*: Blocks on the lower portion are rotated. Matching adjacent seams, sew the blocks together in each row. Press seams in alternate directions for adjacent rows. Matching adjacent seams, sew the rows together in order. Press the seams in one direction.
- 9. Sew two 2" x WOF C1820 Black inner border strips together end to end. Press. Repeat with remaining strips to make four long strips. Cut two 2" × 72¹/2" side borders and two 2" × 75¹/2" top/bottom borders. Sew one side border to each side of the quilt top. Press. Sew one top/bottom border to the top, and the other to the bottom edge of the quilt top. Press.
- 10. Sew two $3^{1/2}$ " x WOF C8109 Black outer border strips end to end. Press. Repeat with remaining strips to make four long strips. Cut two at $3^{1/2}$ " × $75^{1/2}$ " side borders and two $3^{1/2}$ " × $81^{1/2}$ " top/bottom borders. Join one side border to each side of the


quilt top. Press. Join one top/bottom border to the top, and the other to the bottom edge of the quilt top. Press.

Finishing

- 11. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing, and quilt as desired.
- 12. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
- 13. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.
