



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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5226-22 Rick-Rack Plaid - Pink), cut:

• (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 3/8" squares.

Fabric B (5231-11 Polka Dots - Light Blue), cut:

• (3) 3 3/8" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 3/8" squares.

Fabric C (1351-Carnation Just Color! - Carnation) cut:

• (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 3/8" squares.

Fabric D (5225-22 Spools - Pink), cut:

• (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 3/8" squares.

Fabric E (5232-22 Thread Scroll - Pink) cut:

• (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 3/8" squares.

Fabric F (5230-21 Ditsy Floral - Multi), cut:

• (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 3/8" squares.

Fabric G (5231-22 Polka Dots - Pink), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (5224-22 Collage - Pink), cut:

• (1) 28" square for the back.




Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.


Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.


1. Place 3 %" Fabric A square on top of (1) 3 %" Fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 3" square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (16) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 4-6 for fabric identification and placement to make (16) of each unit square for Unit 2 through Unit 4.



- 3. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to the left side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.
- 4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 8 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (8) 5 ½" Block Two squares.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)


- 5. Sew (2) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares together, alternating them, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
- 6. Sew (2) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares together, alternating them, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
- 7. Sew the (4) Rows together, in numerical order, to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

8. Press the quilt top and 28" x 28" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 9. Cut the ends of the (3) Fabric G binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 10. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
