

Requirements

Fabrics from the Small Things... Crafts collection

1. SM35.1- Dressmaking on cream - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
2. SM34.1 - Sewing on light blue - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
3. SM32.3 - Knitting and crochet on grey - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
4. SM36.1 - Painting on yellow - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
5. SM33.1 - Quilting on natural - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
6. BB110 - Bumbleberries Rock - fat $\frac{1}{4}$

Wadding 18" x 18"

Backing fabric - $\frac{1}{2}$ m

1 x 16" x 16" cushion pad

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From each of the fabrics 1, 2, 3 and 4 cut

1 x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

1 x $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x $3\frac{3}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 5 cut

2 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " sides

2 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " top & bottom

From fabric 6

1 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

2 x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

Making up the block



diagram 1

Lay out your fabric pieces for the block as in diagram 1.

Start with stitching the four corners triangles together to make a square.

Next stitch the two small triangles together and then sew this to the large triangle to make a square.

Last the centre square, sewing two small triangles together and then stitch the two together to make a square.

Lay out in rows.

Stitch the rows together and then sew the rows to make the block.

Border

Take fabric 5 and sew the two strips to the sides and then top and bottom to complete the cushion top.

Quilting

Place the cushion top onto the wadding and quilt by hand or machine.

Envelope back for cushion

Cut two pieces of fabric the width of the cushion front x $\frac{2}{3}$ of the length. For example, a 16" cushion would need two pieces 16" x 10".

1. Turn in and hem one long edge on each piece.
2. Place the cushion front face up on your work table.
3. Place one piece of the backing fabric face down on top of the cushion front matching top and side edges.
4. Place the second piece of backing fabric face down on the cushion front matching bottom and side edges.
5. Pin in place and stitch all round.
6. Turn right side out.

Cushion 2

1. SM35.2 - Dressmaking on light purple
2. SM34.3 - Sewing on red
3. SM32.1 - Knitting and crochet on cream
4. SM36.3 - Painting on grey
5. SM33.2 - Quilting on wine
6. BB111 - Bumbleberries Indigo

Wadding 18" x 18"

Backing fabric - ½m

1 x 16" x 16" cushion pad

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From each of the fabrics 1, 2, 3 and 4 cut

1 x 4⁷/₈" x 4⁷/₈" cut in half diagonally once

1 x 3³/₄" x 3³/₄" cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 5 cut

2 x 2¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" sides

2 x 2¹/₂" x 16¹/₂" top & bottom

From fabric 6

1 x 5¹/₄" x 5¹/₄" cut in half diagonally twice

2 x 4⁷/₈" x 4⁷/₈" cut in half diagonally once

Making up the block



diagram 1

Cushion 3

1. SM35.3 - Dressmaking on grey blue
2. SM34.2 - Sewing on turquoise
3. SM32.2 - Knitting and crochet on pink
4. SM36.2 - Painting on green
5. SM33.3 - Quilting on dark blue
6. BB237 - Bumbleberries Lipstick Red

Wadding 18" x 18"

Backing fabric - ½m

1 x 16" x 16" cushion pad

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From each of the fabrics 1, 2, 3 and 4 cut

1 x 4⁷/₈" x 4⁷/₈" cut in half diagonally once

1 x 3³/₄" x 3³/₄" cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 5 cut

2 x 2¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" sides

2 x 2¹/₂" x 16¹/₂" top & bottom

From fabric 6

1 x 5¹/₄" x 5¹/₄" cut in half diagonally twice

2 x 4⁷/₈" x 4⁷/₈" cut in half diagonally once

Making up the block



Diagram 1
