

Quilt size 66" x 66" - unfinished block size 12½" x 12½"



Main Diagram

Requirements

Fabrics from the Soraya collection

1. A489.1 - Paisley peacock on cream - $1\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 1.30cm
2. A490.3 - Green paisley - 1yd - 1mtr
3. A491.2 - Heart floral on dark pink - $1\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $1\frac{1}{2}$ mtr
4. A492.2 - Paisley elephant on blue - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
5. A493.2 - Small paisley greens - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 70cm
6. BB241 - Bumbleberries Rich Purple - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ mtr
7. BB231 - Bumbleberries Dark Gold - 1yd - 1mtr

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go

Cutting angles on strips for block 1 and border

- 1 -  cut a 45° angle from top left and right corners
- 2 -  cut a 45° angle from bottom left corner
- 3 -  cut a 45° angle from bottom right corner

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

12 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (for block 2)

16 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $13\frac{1}{4}$ " (for border) cut as diagram 1 for cutting angle

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " (for border) cut as in diagram 2

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " (for border) cut as in diagram 3

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (for corner squares for border)

From fabric 2 cut

72 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block 2)

From fabric 3 cut

52 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $9\frac{3}{4}$ " (for block 1) cut as diagram 1 for cutting angle

3 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for border) you may like to play around with the cutting of this piece to match block 1 strips.

From fabric 4 cut

26 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 1)

From fabric 5 cut

13 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 1)

From fabric 6 cut


26 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 2)

4 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 2 and border)

From fabric 7 cut

52 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 1)

Making up the blocks



Block 1



Block 2

Block 1

Place out your pieces for block 1 as in the block diagram 1. Start with the centre pinwheel block. Sewing the triangles together to make a square. Stitch the four squares together for the block centre. Next take two of the triangles and stitch to the opposite sides of the pinwheel, press back and then sew the last two triangles. Now add your strips to the block and then the triangles to each of the corners. You will sew 13 blocks in total.

Block 2

Lay out the fabric pieces for the block as in the block diagram 2.

Stitch the small triangles together to make a square. Next make up the Flying Geese block sewing the small triangles on the long side to the opposite sides on the large triangle on the short sides.

Lay out your pieces and sew in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the block. Stitch 12 blocks in total.

Border



Diagram for border

Place out your pieces for the border, working along the strip sewing the pieces together. On two of the strips stitch a square each end.

Complete the quilt

Lay out the blocks as in the main diagram for the quilt. Sew the rows together and then you will stitch your rows together to complete the quilt centre. On each row press your seams in the opposite way each time this will help when sewing the rows together.

Next stitch the two strips without the squares at each end to the quilt. Sew the last two strips to your quilt.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to the size of the quilt top.


Binding

Use your favourite method from fabric 7 to bind the quilt.

Requirements

Fabrics from the Soraya collection

1. A489.2 - Paisley peacock on dark emerald - $1\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 1.30cm
2. A490.1 - Gold paisley - 1yd - 1mtr
3. A491.3 - Heart floral on black - $1\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $1\frac{1}{2}$ mtr
4. A492.1 - Paisley elephant on cream - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
5. A493.3 - Small paisleys reds - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 70cm
6. BB111 - Bumbleberries Indigo - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ mtr
7. BB241 - Bumbleberries Rich Purple - 1yd - 1mtr

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go

Cutting angles on strips for block 1 and border

- 1 -  cut a 45° angle from top left and right corners
- 2 -  cut a 45° angle from bottom left corner
- 3 -  cut a 45° angle from bottom right corner

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

12 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (for block 2)

16 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $13\frac{1}{4}$ " (for border) cut as diagram 1 for cutting angle

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " (for border) cut as in diagram 2

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " (for border) cut as in diagram 3

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (for corner squares for border)

From fabric 2 cut

72 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block 2)

From fabric 3 cut

52 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $9\frac{3}{4}$ " (for block 1) cut as diagram 1 for cutting angle

3 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for border) you may like to play around with the cutting of this piece to match block 1 strips.

From fabric 4 cut

26 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 1)

From fabric 5 cut

13 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 1)

From fabric 6 cut

26 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 2)

4 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 2 and border)

From fabric 7 cut

52 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 1)

Making up the blocks



Block 1

Block 1

Place out your pieces for block 1 as in the block diagram 1. Start with the centre pinwheel block. Sewing the triangles together to make a square. Stitch the four squares together for the block centre. Next take two of the triangles and stitch to the opposite sides of the pinwheel, press back and then sew the last two triangles. Now add your strips to the block and then the triangles to each of the corners. You will sew 13 blocks in total.

Block 2

Lay out the fabric pieces for the block as in the block diagram 2.

Stitch the small triangles together to make a square. Next make up the Flying Geese block sewing the small triangles on the long side to the opposite sides on the large triangle on the short sides.

Lay out your pieces and sew in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the block. Stitch 12 blocks in total.

Border



Diagram for border

Place out your pieces for the border, working along the strip sewing the pieces together. On two of the strips stitch a square each end.

Complete the quilt

Lay out the blocks as in the main diagram for the quilt. Sew the rows together and then you will stitch your rows together to complete the quilt centre. On each row press your seams in the opposite way each time this will help when sewing the rows together.

Next stitch the two strips without the squares at each end to the quilt. Sew the last two strips to your quilt.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to the size of the quilt top.


Binding

Use your favourite method from fabric 7 to bind the quilt.

Requirements

Fabrics from the Soraya collection

1. A489.3 - Paisley peacock on black - $1\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 1.30cm
2. A490.2 - Pink paisley - 1yd - 1mtr
3. A491.1 - Heart floral on cream - $1\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $1\frac{1}{2}$ mtr
4. A492.3 - Paisley elephant on black - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
5. A493.1 - Small paisley yellows - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 70cm
6. BB240 - Bumbleberries Forest Green - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ mtr
7. BB231 - Bumbleberries Dark Gold - 1yd - 1mtr

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go

Cutting angles on strips for block 1 and border

- 1 -  cut a 45° angle from top left and right corners
- 2 -  cut a 45° angle from bottom left corner
- 3 -  cut a 45° angle from bottom right corner

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

12 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (for block 2)

16 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $13\frac{1}{4}$ " (for border) cut as diagram 1 for cutting angle

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " (for border) cut as in diagram 2

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " (for border) cut as in diagram 3

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (for corner squares for border)

From fabric 2 cut

72 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once (for block 2)

From fabric 3 cut

52 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $9\frac{3}{4}$ " (for block 1) cut as diagram 1 for cutting angle

3 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for border) you may like to play around with the cutting of this piece to match block 1 strips.

From fabric 4 cut

26 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 1)

From fabric 5 cut

13 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 1)

From fabric 6 cut


26 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 2)

4 x 7¼" x 7¼" cut in half diagonally twice (for block 2 and border)


From fabric 7 cut

52 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once (for block 1)

Making up the blocks



Block 1

Block 1

Place out your pieces for block 1 as in the block diagram 1. Start with the centre pinwheel block. Sewing the triangles together to make a square. Stitch the four squares together for the block centre. Next take two of the triangles and stitch to the opposite sides of the pinwheel, press back and then sew the last two triangles. Now add your strips to the block and then the triangles to each of the corners. You will sew 13 blocks in total.

Block 2

Lay out the fabric pieces for the block as in the block diagram 2.

Stitch the small triangles together to make a square. Next make up the Flying Geese block sewing the small triangles on the long side to the opposite sides on the large triangle on the short sides.

Lay out your pieces and sew in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the block. Stitch 12 blocks in total.

Border



Diagram for border

Place out your pieces for the border, working along the strip sewing the pieces together. On two of the strips stitch a square each end.

Complete the quilt

Lay out the blocks as in the main diagram for the quilt. Sew the rows together and then you will stitch your rows together to complete the quilt centre. On each row press your seams in the opposite way each time this will help when sewing the rows together.

Next stitch the two strips without the squares at each end to the quilt. Sew the last two strips to your quilt.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to the size of the quilt top.

Binding

Use your favourite method from fabric 7 to bind the quilt.
