

# STARLIGHT PATTERN

Materials and Cutting		
Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
 Moonscape Stella-1150 Vapor	2 1/2 yards	Cut: 2 strips, 12 1/2" x width of fabric (WOF). Sub-cut 2 <b>B3</b> rectangles, 12 1/2" x 18 1/2", 2 <b>B2</b> squares, 12 1/2" x 12 1/2", and 2 <b>B1</b> rectangles, 12 1/2" x 6 1/2". 6 strips, 6 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 56 <b>A2</b> rectangles, 6 1/2" x 3 1/2". 5 strips, 3 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 56 <b>A4</b> squares, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".
 Moonscape Stella-1150 Denim	1 1/4 yards	Cut: 11 strips, 3 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 112 <b>A1</b> squares, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".
 Moonscape Stella-1150 Bronze	1/2 yard	Cut: 6 strips, 2 1/2" x WOF, for binding.
 Tossed Unicorns Stella-D2555 Twilight	1/4 yard	Cut: 3 <b>A3</b> squares, 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".
 Dreamtopia Stella-D2554 White	1/4 yard each	From each fabric, cut: 2 <b>A3</b> squares, 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".
 Field of Dreams Stella-D2556 Twilight		
 Wall of Fame Stella-D2557 Twilight		
 Bunny Floral Stella-D2558 Sterling	1/4 yard each	From each fabric, cut: 1 <b>A3</b> square, 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".
 Tossed Unicorns Stella-D2555 Sterling		
 Blossom Stella-D2559 White	3 3/8 yards	Cut: 1 strip, 6 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 3 <b>A3</b> squares, 6 1/2" x 6 1/2". Remove the selvages from the remaining yardage and cut the yardage into two equal lengths for the backing.




# STARLIGHT QUILT PATTERN

*Note:* All seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise specified. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.


## Make the Star Blocks

1 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each **A1** square. Place one **A1** square right sides together on one end of an **A2** rectangle. Sew on the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press the triangle and seam allowance toward the outer corner. Repeat to add a second **A1** triangle to the opposite end of the rectangle, as shown. Make a total of 56 Flying Geese units.



**Flying Geese unit**  
Make 56.

2 Arrange four Flying Geese units from step 1, four **A4** squares, and one **A3** square in three rows of three elements each, as shown. Sew the elements in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances toward the **A4** and **A3** squares. Matching seam lines, sew the rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances toward the center row. Make a total of 14 Star Blocks.

## Assemble the Quilt


1 Referring to the quilt photo and Quilt Assembly Diagram for block placement and orientation, arrange the Star Blocks, **B2** squares, and **B1** and **B3** rectangles in four vertical rows. Sew the blocks, squares and rectangles in each row together along adjacent edges. Press.

2 Join the rows together adjacent edges. Press the seams in one direction.

## Finishing

1 Using a 1/2" seam allowance, join the two large backing rectangles along one long edge to complete the quilt backing. Press.

2 Layer the quilt backing, batting, and quilt top. Quilt as desired. Stitch a scant 1/4" from the edge around the perimeter of the quilt. Trim the excess backing and batting. Use your favorite method to bind the quilt.
